Project At a glance

Status	Planning and approvals stage

Scoping report now available

A Scoping Report for the project was submitted to the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) in June. The report provides a project description and identifies the scale and type of potential impacts. The Department will now review the report and will seek advice from local Council and other government agencies about what should be included in the Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) for this project.

Next steps towards planning approval

Once the SEARs are issued, we will prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). We'll be conducting further environmental studies and seeking feedback from the community over 2020 and early 2021 to inform preparation of the EIS.

EPBC Referral

Preliminary field surveys have identified the known or likely presence of some species listed as threatened under the Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act, including the Spotted Quoll and the Koala. WWPL will refer the project to the Australian Government Minister for the Environment for review and approval, and will undertake further study to ensure any potential negative impacts to these and other animal and plant species are carefully considered and addressed.

Community Consultative Committee – formal engagement

The views of the community are vital to this project. A Community Consultative Committee (CCC) will soon be established to allow open, transparent discussion between representatives of the community, WinterbourneWind, the local Council and other stakeholders, on issues directly relating to the project.

We expect to establish the CCC in late-2020, subject to government health restrictions relating to the COVID-19 pandemic. CCC meetings will occur approximately four times per year and more frequently whilst the development approval is being assessed. WinterbourneWind will be inviting expressions of interest for local community members to join the CCC later in the year.





Indicative project design

The indicative project layout includes 126 wind turbines, three substations, and a transmission line to connect the wind farm to the existing grid network. This design incorporates the results of preliminary environmental assessments as well as feedback from involved landowners and neighbouring community members.

As the project evolves, the design will be subject to ongoing review and development to ensure that wind energy production and project benefits can be maximized while social and environmental impacts are minimized.
